The pursuit of civil and human rights is a journey filled with challenges and opportunities. In 2024, Church and Society has remained steadfast in advocating for peace, fostering collaboration, and equipping United Methodists to be bold witnesses for justice.

Together, we worked hard to create change in 2024.

• **Empowering Civic Engagement:** Through our partnerships with the Baltimore-Washington Conference and Strengthening Black Churches for the 21st Century, we helped create the Sacred Voters Toolkit. By equipping local churches with preaching materials, Bible studies, and activities to encourage voting and civic participation, at least 20 United Methodists became Election Ambassadors and Poll Chaplains to support the democratic process.

• **Strengthening Congressional Relationships:** Church and Society staff spent time deepening relationships with congressional offices this year, paving the way for future advocacy.

Raising Awareness Through Programming: Learning opportunities like the Seminar Program and our Justice Talks webinar series have helped equip and mobilize United Methodists to engage decision makers on pressing issues, from white Christian nationalism to protecting democracy.

We are determined to drive legislative progress on critical issues like immigration and criminal justice reform, while empowering United Methodists to be bold witnesses for justice.
